

#### POPPY CAMPAIGN Report to General Meeting November 23, 2021

On behalf of Colleen Gammack and myself as co-chairwomen of the 2021 Poppy Campaign, we thank the following committee members Raymond Burgess, Laura and Mel Hyrich, Richard McDonald, Bill Spring, Cindy Stumme, Murray Tallant for their work and support.

This year's campaign had a quick start on October 29, 2021, and a fast track to end on November 11, 2021, and the time in-between was highlighted by a mixture of old and new ideas, all working together to culminate into a successful 2021 Poppy Campaign.

The distribution of 3 - Pay Tribute boxes to PetSmart -18<sup>th</sup> Street; Subway on 18<sup>th</sup>; Popeye's Louisiana Kitchen on Victoria & 10<sup>th</sup> was a scramble at the beginning but by the end seemed to be successful. They were provided by HSBC on a trial basis.

This year POS or Point of Sale was discussed, and Cindy Stumme organized our committee to "hit the streets" and canvass various businesses to ask for a Poppy donation electronically at the end of their customers transaction. It was discovered that a letter will need to go out perhaps in September, in order that those stores with head office control needed permission to allow POS on their tills. However, businesses on board this year were Canadian Tire, Sobey's on 18<sup>th</sup>, Sobey's West End, Heritage Co-Op. And we have not heard or received a cheque in the amount of their POS. as of today.

This year Poppy route volunteers delivered 23 routes, dropped off 316 boxes, and collected many individual Poppy donations. And the volunteers who "stepped up" to "step out" into the Brandon community to deliver Poppy boxes was terrific again this year. And to fill the void left from those unable to volunteer, the ACC student volunteers from the class of A/Sgt Alice Potter, Brandon Police Services Public Safety Instructor, joined the Poppy box delivery crew.

A sincere 'thank you' to every volunteer who worked, together as one, to collect the local Poppy Funds for 2021.

As of December 1, 2021 the Poppy Funds collected is \$32,500.00 with a few collections from point of sale stores still to come in.


That's why I was delighted to learn that




