

## National Legion Week September 17–23, 2023



#### BACKGROUND

The Dominion Executive Committee approved the establishment of the first National Legion Week. Already marked by some Provincial Commands and their Branches since the 1980s, the annual observance will now become a coast-to-coast celebration!

#### OBJECTIVE

National Legion Week is designed to educate visitors on the good work their local Branch does in their community. It reinforces the important role Branches play in our shared mission to serve and support our Veterans, as well as contribute to the well-being of so many communities. It serves as a vehicle to drive new traffic to Branches, attract new members and sign up new volunteers. This year, it can also include a salute to RCMP Veterans who celebrated the 150th anniversary (May 23) of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police.

#### DATES

The commemoration will continue to be held each September, with start and end dates that vary slightly from year to year. It kicks off on the third Sunday of the month in honour of Battle of Britain Day and wraps up on the following Saturday.

## 2 September 1945

<u>Colonel</u> Lawrence Vincent Moore Cosgrave, <u>DSO</u> & <u>Bar</u> (August 28, 1890 – July 28, 1971) was a <u>Canadian</u> soldier and diplomat. He was the Canadian signatory to the <u>Japanese Instrument of</u> <u>Surrender</u> at the end of <u>World War II</u>.


#### The Japanese Instrument of Surrender

During <u>World War II</u> Cosgrave was the Canadian Military Attache to Australia, for the <u>South West Pacific Area</u>. On September 2, 1945 he was the Canadian representative at the official surrender of Japan, and signed the <u>Japanese Instrument of Surrender</u> on behalf of Canada aboard the battleship <u>USS *Missouri*</u> in Tokyo Bay. When his turn to sign came, Cosgrave inadvertently placed his signature one line too low on the Japanese copy of the documents, signing on the line for the French Republic. This was attributed to his being blind in one eye, through an injury sustained in the First World War.<sup>[8][9]</sup>

The problem was easily corrected, by US General <u>Richard Sutherland</u> who crossed out "French Republic" and wrote in "Dominion of Canada" under Cosgrave's signature, then made similar corrections for the rest of the document.<sup>[10][11]</sup> Air Vice-Marshal <u>Leonard Monk Isitt</u>, the Dominion of <u>New Zealand</u> representative, left without a blank to sign, had to have his name and country written in at the bottom margin of the document. The Japanese delegates accepted the corrected copy.<sup>[12]</sup> Cosgrave did not repeat this error on the Allied copy.<sup>[13]</sup>

When will summer end and the cooler days of fall begin? The autumnal equinox also called the September equinox—arrives on Saturday, September 23. Not only do temperatures fall, but also plant life slows down and so do we. Read about the signs of fall and the ways we will mark the equinox.

### When Is the Autumnal Equinox?

The fall equinox arrives on Saturday, September 23, 2023, at 02:50 A.M. EDT in the Northern Hemisphere. The equinox occurs at the same moment worldwide.

## What Is the Autumnal Equinox?

The **autumnal equinox** is an astronomical event that marks the start of autumn (or "fall"). In the Northern Hemisphere, the autumnal equinox occurs in September; in the Southern Hemisphere, it occurs in March.

## What Is an Equinox?

During an **equinox**, the Sun crosses what we call the "celestial equator"—an imaginary extension of Earth's equator line into space. The equinox occurs precisely when the Sun's center passes through this line.

For those in the Northern Hemisphere, when the Sun crosses the equator going from north to south, this marks the autumnal equinox; when it crosses from south to north, this marks the vernal equinox. In the Southern Hemisphere, it's the reverse.
