



IMPERIAL WAR GRAVES COMMISSION AND VETERANS' PLOT (continued from January 2025 Legionnaire) ... This indenture made the First day of September A.D. 1926.....thereon shall be known as "Cross of Sacrifice Fund"...

NOW THEREFORE THIS INDENTURE WITNESSETH:

- 1. The Legion shall pay to the Trustees, who shall receive and hold the said sum, and invest and re-invest the same, and the unexpended interest thereon, in any investment authorized by law for trust funds, preferably Dominion of Canada Bonds, and the said Trustees, and the survivors of them, and their Successors in Office, and the survivors of them, shall haver permanent and absolute control of the said sum upon the following trust:
 - (A) To expand the income arising therefrom, of a competent portion thereof for any necessary repairs on the said Cross of Sacrifice, or in beautifying and maintaining the grounds surrounding same in the Soldiers plot in the Brandon Cemetery, over and above the amount expended by the City of Brandon for the care and maintenance of said Cross and said plot, as in their absolute discretion they shall see fit.
 - (B) To hold the principal of the said sum intact unless owing to some unforeseen circumstances the Trustees consider it necessary or expedient to use the said sum, or any portion thereof, in connection with the said Cross, or the grounds surrounding same, and in this case upon trust.
 - (C) To use the said sum, or any necessary portion thereof as in their absolute discretion they shall see fit.
- 2. The majority of the Trustees, competent and willing to act, shall form a quorum, and under Clause (C) above mentioned and decision of the quorum must be unanimous.
- 3. In the event of any person or persons entitled to be a Trustee or Trustees refusing to act, or to continue to act, being of any reason unable to act, this remaining Trustees or Trustee, shall have full power of all the Trustees, and shall control the said fund.
- 4. Any person holding temporarily and office which would qualify the permanent holder thereof to be a Trustee, shall himself be a Trustee while so holding such office.

In witness thereof the Party of the First Part has caused its Corporate Seal to be hereto affixed, attested by the hands of the President and Secretary, the proper officers in that behalf, and the Trustees have hereto set their hands and seals.



The official birthstone for the month of February is the stunning purple **amethyst** and hence the February birthstone color is **purple**.

Other birthday symbols include the <u>birth</u> <u>flowers for February</u> which are the Violet, Iris and Primrose.



When to See the Full Moon in February

February's <u>Full Moon</u> is at its most illuminated at **13:53 UTC on February 12**, 2025.

The Moon will appear full in the days before and after peak illumination, and is the only phase in which the Moon is up all night. Moonrise and moonset generally occur around sunset and sunrise.

We often say that the Full Moon does the opposite of the Sun. In February, it will be up for more than 12 hours in the Northern Hemisphere, while it will be up for less than 12 hours in the Southern Hemisphere.

Groundhog Day, observed on February 2nd in the United States and Canada, is based on the Pennsylvania Dutch superstition that if a groundhog sees its shadow, there will be six more weeks of winter.

How Many Days Are in February?

It depends! February is the only month to have a length of fewer than 30 days! It's usually 28 days, though February is 29 days long in <u>leap years</u> such as 2028.

But why 28 days? The Roman King Numa had originally made all months 29 days, as Romans believed that even numbers were unlucky. However, the sum of all the months was an even number. So February, a month for honoring the dead, was chosen as the unlucky month to consist of 28 days.

Of course, the calendar went through many more changes, but the "28" days for February have stuck.

The chance of being born on February 29th is about 1 in 1,461. People born on this day are sometimes called "leaplings" or "leapers."

February 4th is World Cancer Day, an international day to raise awareness of cancer and encourage its prevention, detection, and treatment.
